EVERGREENS

(Bundles of 25 = \$14.00)

Norway Spruce (Picea abies) 10-18"
This graceful pyramidal has sharp, shiny, dark green needles. Beautiful spreading branches with drooping twigs. An extremely hardy tree that is successful under most soil conditions. Makes a charming Christmas tree, an appealing ornamental specimen, or a protective windbreak. Fastest growing spruce.

Colorado Blue Spruce (Picea Pungens glauca) 6-10"
The seed source is of the finest quality from dependable sources. Makes a handsome ornamental specimen, and decorative Christmas tree.

Douglas Fir (Pseudotsuga menziessi glauca) 10-20"
A splendid pyramidal evergreen conifer, with short-stalked flat, dark green or bluish green needles, 3/4" to 1-1/4" long. Bears cones at maturity 2" to 4" long. A rapid grower, hardy tree that grows well in a variety of soils, but does best in deep well-drained soils. Beautiful Christmas tree, picturesque ornamental, windbreak, and can be sheared as a hedge.

Concolor Fir (Abies concolor) 7-15"
Widely used for Christmas trees and ornamentals. Needles are 1", and have excellent fragrance and retention. Grows best in cool, moist, sheltered locations.

Fraser Fir (Abies fraseri) 5-9"
A medium-sized pyramidal growing fir of great beauty. Grows well in a variety of soils, under general conditions. Good for ornamentals and Christmas trees. Likes cool soil and northern exposure, not necessary to have full sun full day.

White Spruce (Picea glauca) 7-14"
An extremely hardy evergreen with short bluish-green needles. A rapid grower preferring well-drained loam, but is successfully planted in most other soils. Makes a beautiful Christmas tree, ornamental specimen, when planted as a single or stately windbreak planted in rows.

White Pine (Pinus strobus) 5-10"
A majestic evergreen beauty when planted as a single specimen tree, this very hardy pine grows stately and gracefully tall. Needles are soft and bluish-green in color. Growth can be 12" to 18" per year. Ideal for specimen planting, shade windbreaks and appealing Christmas trees.

NEW Canadian Hemlock (Tsuga canadensis) 8-15"
Short flat needles varying from dark green and light green during growing season. A very hardy, easily transplanted conifer grows well in a variety of soils. Prefers part shade, but will do well in full shade or sun. Likes moisture.

GROUND COVER

Vinca minor (Myrtle [Periwinkle])
The hardiest of ground cover. Has dark lustrous green leaves and lilac-blue or white flowers. Grows well under shade and in areas where grass will not grow. Stays green through Summer and Winter.

DECIDUOUS TREES

Pin Oak (Quercus palustris) \$1.50 ea. 24-36"
The best known oak for street and ornamental planting. Forms a symmetrical pyramidal head with drooping branches. Beautiful green foliage of leaves 3" to 5" wide with 5 pointed lobes, bright green leaves turning yellow to radiant red in autumn. Prefers somewhat moist soil. A fast growing tree with light to dark grayish-brown bark. Mature height of 75-80 feet.

Black Walnut (Juglans nigra) \$1.50 ea. 36-42"
Native nut tree of eastern United States. Medium size, round-headed tree known chiefly for its edible nuts and prized for its fine wood in furniture construction. Grows best in fertile, well-drained soil. Height at maturity 50-75 feet.

Chinese Chestnut (Castanea mollissima) \$1.50 ea. 18-24"
Hardy, blight-resistant, fast growing tree which bears nuts slightly larger than the almost extinct American Chestnut. Plant two or more for pollination. Height at maturity about 30-35 feet.

White Flowering Dogwood (Cornus florida) \$1.50 ea. 18-24"
One of the most popular of native flowering trees. In early Spring it is covered with white-petaled flowers; in early Fall with red berries and beautiful crimson leaves.

NEW American Cranberry Viburnum (Viburnum trilobum) \$1.50 ea. 24-30"
Very hardy easy to grow. Fall colors range from yellow to red purple with white flowers. Fruit is scarlet red in fall. Good winter wildlife food. Shrub is 8-12' at maturity with arching branches.
